ABOUT CTC

COMMUNITIES THAT CARE (CTC) is a way for community members to work together to reduce youth problem behaviors. The Youth Survey is given to students in our county. This survey is then used by Chippewa County to create an action plan unique to the youth here. This allows the coalition to address priority risk factors and helps identify protective factors to improve in our community. This happens through 5 ongoing, evidenced-based phases that provide the community with the best results.

THE FIVE PHASES OF CTC

<u>Get Started</u>- Preparing the community for CTC <u>Get Organized</u>-Educate Key Leaders and form the CTC Community Board

Develop Community Profile-Implement the CTC Youth Survey and analyze the results

<u>Create a Plan</u>-Determine the best programs to invest in implementing based on current resources <u>Implement and Evaluate-</u> Implement programs and evaluate effectiveness of the programs

CTC IN ACTION

CTC takes a commitment of 1 to 3 hours a month. All CTC members take part in a training to learn how CTC works. We only hold the training a couple times a year, but you can start working with a work group right away. There are also a activity group (that only covers special events) and an everyday outreach group. The entire Community Board meets every other month throughout the year. Breaking into work groups has a number of advantages, such as making it easier to schedule meetings, and allowing each work group to focus on specific tasks and timelines.
